Your Best is NOT Enough...And That's OK Joe Wells

Recently, while talking with my son about being a disciple of Jesus, he said something during our discussion that struck me and caused me to stop and think.

What did he say?

He expressed the same sentiment I've heard from many people regarding how we will never be "good enough" in our following Jesus. To that point, he is correct; however, that was not the point that caused me to pause and reflect. It wasn't until he stressed that we have to give Jesus our "best" in our walk and trust in the grace of God along the way. Like a car that abruptly breaks, that's when my mind halted.

It caused me to pause because it hit me. This mindset of "giving God my best" has taken hold in the church and society. With our desire to be pleasing to God and bring Him honor and glory, we have adopted a mentality that places the emphasis on us as the disciples.

Us giving God our best...is it possible this premise is incomplete?

Now, don't think I'm suggesting or hinting at the opposite of the statement. I'm not making a case for the extreme opposite of this statement that claims since we can't be good enough, why even try to be and do what God desires? That belief is flat-out wrong and rebellious.

Instead, I'm making the case that when the emphasis in our walk with God is that we do our best, the fulcrum or the hinge of that statement is on us, and that's never where it is supposed to be.

What if, instead of saying we need to give God our best, we say we need to be disciples who surrender every aspect of our lives to Him? In other words, instead of God wanting my best, He wants my total surrender. What might that do in our lives as we follow Jesus?

For starters, it would give us more peace because the emphasis is on what God will do as we surrender instead of what we'll do in our "best." Secondly, it brings clarity to my daily walk. My purpose is simple when surrendering to God is my mindset and life, and it's all about Him. Lastly, my living hope (1 Peter 1:3) becomes much more of a regular anchor and reminder of where I'm going by God's grace. My anchor is firmly rooted when my hope is not in how well I do but entirely in Jesus.

Giving God your best is not bad; however, completely surrendering your will and walk is what He desires.
