Healer of Sorrow

suppose tear-filled eyes are an inevitable experience in our journey through this

fallen world. As I reflect on my limited and short-lived experience, working through my late 20's, I have frequently found myself losing the battle of holding back the waterworks. Though I argue, when you have Wes Autrey as a father-in-law, Corey Sawyers as a mentor, and Bob Turner as a teacher, my effort for resisting crying is vanity.

Two times in Luke's account of Jesus, we see our Lord console with the words, "don't cry."

- In times of loss (7:13) As Jesus journeyed through the town of Nain, He looked over and saw a grieving mother walking beside the casket of her only son. When a woman became a widow in this time era, she solely relied on her children to help care for her (they didn't have life insurance back then). Additionally, she is forced into the to experience of grief; something any parent faces when burying a child. She is emotionally lost and economically paralyzed. When Jesus looks at the scene, compassion was His reaction. "Don't cry" were His words to the woman, followed by His working power to restore the child back to life. Luke beautifully notes, "Jesus gave him back to his mother" (same terminology used in 1 Kings 17:23).
- 2) In times of hopelessness (8:52) To say that Jesus was popular would be an understatement. We read of crowds constantly surrounding the Lord that they may experience His healing in their life. Such was the case for a man named Jairus who came falling at the feet of Jesus, begging Him to heal his 12 year old daughter who was sick. Jesus got caught up en route to the house of Jairus by a woman who had a incurable hemorrhage. After inadvertently healing her, Jesus proceeded to the house where He was greeted with the news, "don't bother the teacher, the girl is dead." We read that "all the people were willing," not just the parents. The Christ instructs, "stop crying, she is not dead but asleep." He would then proceed to bring her back to life and allow her to return to her family.

The lesson is so much more grand than the miraculous act of bringing someone back to life. Rather, the message broadcasts the love, compassion, and intention God has for us. When Jesus told the individuals to stop crying, He didn't leave them in disarray; He wiped away tears with divine power. In a magnificent expectation, we eagerly await the fulfillment of God's promise, "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning, or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."
