A GOOD Night's Sleep

have been in fulltime ministry for close to twenty years. In that time, I've had my share of long,

sleepless nights. The reasons vary like flavors of ice cream at Baskin Robbins. At times the sleeplessness came from concern for loved ones being ill or maybe even on the verge of death. Flared tempers from disagreements have left me wondering, "What's going to happen next." There have been times when ongoing theological disagreements kept me awake as I worried about what the next email would say and how would I respond. Regardless of the circumstance, these sleepless nights tended to have one major thing in common. They were fueled by a level of anxiety that was hard to shake.

David seems to have had a lot of anxieties in his life as well. The Psalms are filled with lines that speak of his distress from enemies, sin, or some other adversary. For example, in Psalm 3, he begins, "O LORD, how many are my foes! Many are rising against me, many are saying of my soul, 'There is no salvation for him in God.'" With words like these, I can envision the man of God having a few sleepless nights of his own. Yet, David found solace to sleep the night away.

"I lay down and slept; I woke again...I will not be afraid of many thousands of people who have set themselves against me all around" (Psalm 3:5-6). Where does this comfort come from? How is this troubled leader able to find the good night's sleep? It comes from the confidence he has in God to protect in the troubled times.

In vv. 3-4, David writes, "But you, O LORD, are a shield about me, my glory, and the lifter of my head. I cried aloud to the LORD, and he answered me from his holy hill."

Comforting sleep comes when a soul knows that he/she is safe from harm. Our minds can be at ease from the confidence that no real danger can arise while we are disconnected from the conscious world. David knew that God would cover (shield), elevate (glory), and comfort (lift his head) him in midst of his anxieties.

Our anxieties may not be "thousands of people who have set themselves against me," but they are no less troubling. The harm we fear may be the pain of loss, the damaging of our reputation, or perhaps the stress of verbal attacks on our faith. However, we can still find solace in God being our shield, glory, and lifter. Like David, he will see us through the trials and elevate us in due time.

Tonight, when your head hits the pillow, if something is making your heart hurt, take a few minutes and meditate on Psalm 3. Lift your pain to the God of heaven who saw David through long nights, and he will do the same for you. No matter what's happening, you can have a good night's sleep.
