The Struggle of Two Temples

The deeper I dive into the Old Testament, the more I am struck with awe as I gaze upon the scenery. Being able to witness the salvation of the Lord from terrifying armies, watching grace and mercy be poured out to a rebellious people, hearing the shouts and cries of the first temple worship, experiencing heartbreak and grief as man aimlessly stumbles in darkness. It's a beautiful and inspiring journey to walk through this breathtaking canon of the Hebrew scriptures. Yet, at the same time I am also met with the harsh and unsuspecting interrogative of "where do I stand in this lesson?"

Such was the case as I personally studied through the brief two-chapter book of Haggai. In Haggai's time, the Jews experienced the resolve of captivity. The Assyrians were defeated, the Babylonians were defeated, and the Persians gave the Jews liberty to go back home and continue with their life. You can imagine the excitement that permeated the Hebrew people as they returned home after many generations of exile. They quickly got to work on reconstructing the temple and the energy was electric. Until it wasn't.

Have you ever started a project and never finished it? That's what happened here with the temple. You don't have to read very far into Haggai to see how this upset the Lord. Haggai 1:4, "Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains in ruin?" You can hear the frustration in God's tone as He draws a contrast. "You have planted much, but harvested little. You eat, but never have enough. You drink, but never have your fill. You put on clothes, but are not warm. You earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it" (1:6). The people got too distracted with life's physicality, they abandoned their spirituality.

Then the introspection hits. I love praising on Sunday, worshipping with other believers, praying for our futures, and sharing stories of our week. But then Monday happens, and so do all the other days of the week. I seemingly forget the priority of God's temple and focus on MY temple—the things I wear, the food I eat, the retirement that I woefully try to save, the upkeep on my car, and so on. Those things aren't wrong, until they completely bulldoze my progress in the Kingdom. I believe it's possible to carry a balance between the "two temples" of life. God's frustration wasn't that His people had houses; it was that they focused so much on their things that His house became neglected. Eventually, the people turned around and through the leadership of Zerubbabel, they got to work. Let's carry the momentum and get to work.
