With the unfair predicament of imprisonment, the apostle Paul kept a rejoiceful attitude and disposition. Why? Not because it was working out for him but because Christ was being advanced. That is his reason for rejoicing. That is his "upside-down Thanksgiving."

This season, as you celebrate, stop and consider being grateful for the rough patches you've encountered this year. Especially be thankful that through your difficulties, God was glorified.
